A Single Donation Goes a Long Way

For seventy-six years we have sought donors through the same methods they began in 1949 to curtail the number of solicitations made to businesses and individuals.

With one donation, donors can fund multiple local programs.

Many milestones were met this year. I completed my eleventh year as the Executive Director of United Way of Butte and Anaconda. United Way went through a re-branding, and we now have new colors, new taglines, and a new logo. We also undertook new fundraising events to supplement the decline in employee and corporate giving.

This past year, our partner agencies provided programming to 7,341 individuals. They helped educate youth and expand their horizons, provided food and shelter to those young & old and provided professional assistance to disabled children and their families.

In 24-25, our Community Events impacted 2,213 individuals. Before the start of the new school year, 101 youth participated in our *Dress a Child*. Christmas gifts were given to 30 seniors when 20 donors took names from our *Angel Giving Tree*. Ten groups in January through February assembled 873 sacks of soup during our *Stone Soup* events. Our *Day of the Child* event was held in March where 69 children experienced the "Wild, Wild West". We finished our year with our *Day of Caring* event assisting another non-profit's camp.

This year we embarked into the fundraising event arena. We hosted the Festival of Trees again this year. Our initial BINGO event was held in March and our Virtual Golf tournament was held in June.




Outdoor Recreation

Public Housing Authority of Butte's Resident Council




